Belgrave Heights Convention Annual Report 2023

As a convention we exist to inspire and equip Christians to love and live for Christ in this world. Our **Vision** is to see the spiritual renewal of God's people for His mission in the world. Our **Mission** is to develop spiritually mature Christians, whose faith and practice is anchored in the Bible, through the teaching and practical application of God's Word.

The year 2023 continued the recovery from Covid and established new expectations which were different to those experienced pre Covid. It was good to be back together again although for some ministries there were less of us. External hirings continued to recover and much of our attention was absorbed in construction of new accommodation and dining facilities. None of what was accomplished in 2023 would have been possible without the wonderful work of the board, staff and many volunteers who coped with the challenges of the year.

We continue to recognise that the 'major core' and strength of our ministry is closely linked to securing the best possible speakers who can model expository Bible teaching and bring relevant application and challenge to our daily discipleship. This Annual Report demonstrates yet again that God continues to bless and encourage the mission of BHC. We are reminded, '*Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding, in all your ways acknowledge Him and He will direct paths.*' Proverbs 3:5-6. Let these words continue to encourage us all.

BHC Board

Members of the Board are elected from and by the Company Members to take responsibility for oversight and to provide guidance for the effective running of the Belgrave Heights Convention.

It continues to be a very great privilege to be able to serve in the role of Chairman for the Convention and its ministries. The Convention continues to major on and have a significant ministry for the faithful preaching and exposition of God's word for the encouragement and building up of God's people in Melbourne and Victoria particularly, but also a much wider reach internationally due to on-line presentations and streaming.

2023 in Review

Governance and Management.

The Board has continued its role in having oversight and watching our legal responsibilities under the ACNC, and in the areas of environmental compliance, Taxation, Workplace health and safety, Privacy, Fund raising processes, Redundancies, Consumer protection legislation etc. Checklists including the ATO Self Governance Check List are useful in this process of review. The CEO will report to the AGM on these areas.

Ministry

The Ministry Committee now takes responsibility for the ministry activities of the Convention largely through the Convention Committees. Its membership has remained steady at the number of 15, but we are aware of the need for new people to help in the running of Convention ministries. We are conscious of needing to replenish the Ministry Committee with people who are committed to the vision of the Convention and who can be representative of our wider community - youth, maturity, ethnic and denominational diversity, gender, etc.

The Ministry Committee has settled into its role of being responsible for all of our ministry activities through the Convention Committees who undertake the event specific work. Some questions have been raised recently with respect to the authority the Ministry Committee has over individual Conventions ministry.

Property and Facilities.

We are very blessed to have the property and facilities that we have so close to the city of Melbourne.

We have been very grateful to have Tony Evans as our Project Manager and, together with the Property Committee, we have been blessed to have many different people with outstanding gifts and abilities to lead the Convention through this project.

It was a delight to be able to officially dedicate and open the 'Hope Centre' on the Sunday afternoon of our recent Summer Convention (31 December 2023). We are very conscious that we still need generous benefactors to raise finances needed in order to repay loans offered to the Convention. With the loan received from Baptist Financial Services we do need to continue to look for different avenues of income for the building. We do recognise that all of this needs to be under-written by prayer and trust in a Father who is able to provide all our needs.

Our thanks go to David Webb as Chairman of the Property Committee and our very grateful thanks to members of the Property Committee who have done exceptional work in helping us save significant costs for the building. We also express our appreciation to the staff and army of volunteers for their commitment and consistent work in 2023.

STAFF AND VOLUNTEERS

None of the above would be able to be achieved without the committed work of the staff and volunteers.

The Lord continues to bless us with a growing *team of willing volunteers*, who help in a multitude of ways, and we give thanks for each one of them. BHC CEO Report

Finalising the Hope Centre was the major activity in a busy year. The availability of the Baptist Financial Services loan later in 2022 and donations, including the million dollar donation later in 2023, enabled work to proceed without financial constraints.

Post Covid Convention attendance varied between events creating different challenges for each committee.

We continue to be accredited with the CMA Standards Council and NARTA (Christian Venues).

Ministry

Experiences of conventions varied post Covid and it was encouraging to successfully launch the Ideas Convention into this situation. Our committees that are responsible for our conventions are pivotal and there is an ongoing need to ensure that they have adequate membership and skills. The Ministry Committee needs to work with the committees to achieve this.

Property

The focus in 2023 was planned to be almost totally on supporting the building project which was how it happened. Unfortunately, the vacancy in the Property Manager position in mid 2023 caused by Devin's illness and subsequent resignation was a challenging gap.

Volunteers

We continue to be blessed with a large volunteer workforce in the property, office and convention activities areas. The property challenge of eight working bees in a row was a spectacular effort in November and December which resulted in the building being not only built but furnished ready for occupation.

Ministry Reports

Summer 2022-23

The Summer Convention was able to be held without Covid restrictions which had restricted us the past two years. The theme of the Convention was 'Kingdom Come! Our place in God's plan'.

Speakers were Ian Coffey (UK) who spoke from the book of Ruth; Wei-Han Kuan (CMS Director, Victoria) who spoke from the book of Revelation, chapters 4-21; and David Robertson (Sydney) ran seminars during the afternoons. An additional seminar was held with respect to the HopeBuilders project. The Global Focus meeting speaker was Wei-Han Kuan.

Mission spots were available at afternoon and evening meetings and these were filled by a number of various Mission agencies by a mixture of video and in person.

All messages were streamed and broadcast on-line.

Easter 2023

The theme of the Easter Convention was 'More than Conquerors'.

Steve Brady (Cayman Islands and UK) spoke from the book of Revelation, chapters 1-3; Gary Millar (Brisbane) spoke from the book of Joshua; Kirk Franklin (Wycliffe Bible Translators) spoke at the Global Focus meeting. Afternoon seminars were run by our speakers and a panel from different Theological Colleges around Melbourne.

The continuing high standard of preaching and application of God's Word is appreciated by many.

The Easter Convention was also live streamed.

VCYC 2022

2023 Events and Review:

One Night Event(s):

We started the year with a new host for our first event of the year. Mitcham Baptist was a new contact through a new committee member. The venue was a good space for the event and also saw large attendance. We had 318 in attendance from 18 churches or youth ministries. This was a significant increase in attendance with new churches joining us. These new contacts were also part of the new churches in attendance at the convention which was great!

With good momentum from the term 1 ONE and solid attendance at the convention, our term 4 one at Holy Trinity Doncaster was also well attended. We had 356 attend from 18 churches or youth ministries. This also included new churches checking out VCYC that we are following up for the 2024 convention. Overall, the good attendance as well as constantly having new churches coming has validated for the executive team the importance of these events for the youth ministries attending as well as being vital for reaching new churches.

Convention:

Following the well attended return to a weekend convention in 2022, the 2023 convention again grew in number of both participants and churches. We had just over 650 in attendance including our volunteers from just over 40 churches. This was a decent increase from the 580 in 2022.

Andy May preached from the Psalms and he was warmly embraced for his clarity, honesty, and humility in preaching God's Word. The theme and passages felt like they were timely and necessary we embrace several new post-covid norms.

The growth of VCYC's attendance continued to stretch our capacity. Catering for over 500 as well as accommodating youth and youth leaders across three locations (as we are using two off-site cabin sites) is a big challenge. In God's kindness we were able to recruit over 70 volunteers to execute the event and the catering team did an amazing job!

We significantly benefited from a more experienced executive team who did their roles exceptionally well. Further, new recruits to the executive team taking on new roles was particularly important to spread the workload better. This was mainly seen in our music team, prayer ministry, and aesthetics.

The weather did play a factor for our event with significant rain and wind for those camping or walking to off-site accommodation. This also resulted in a river running through our prayer tent which was less than ideal.

Overall the VCYC Executive team was thankful to God for a great event and the continued growth of the convention. We are acutely aware of how important VCYC has become for the ministry of several churches and the role we are playing to encourage and promote biblical teaching in youth ministry. The team is eager to continue to work hard for the growth and sustainability of VCYC.

Men's Convention

2023 Convention - The theme for the 2023 Convention was 'Strong Mind Soft Heart' and our 2 main speakers, David Walter from AFES and IFES based in Brisbane and Ed Surrey from CRU based in Perth, shared messages from 1 Peter. David and Ed helped us think about living as Christians today, standing firm for God's truth with strong minds but then learning how to share that truth in a loving way.

Along with David and Ed, Arthur Bolkas shared part of his life story. This involved Arthur being sent to prison via a drug rehabilitation clinic after holding up a number of TAB's at gun point. Then after the fouryear mark of his sentence, God touched and challenged his life. Many men were impacted by Arthur's testimony.

David, Ed and Arthur all led various seminars along with Rhys Bezzant, Senior Lecturer at Ridley College and Ian Harper, Dean and Director of the Melbourne Business School and Co-Dean of the Faculty of Business and Economics at the University of Melbourne. The seminars were all run twice and were well attended. In general, there was very positive feedback about the range and content of the seminars. Some even indicating they were the highlight of the Convention.

Overall numbers were down from 2022 and pre COVID but there was still about 400 men attend on the Friday Night and Saturday. As a trial, we did offer the opportunity for men's groups to stay over for the weekend, incorporating the Convention into weekend, but no groups took up the offer.

Music for the Convention on both the Friday Night and Saturday was again organised by Joel Creek and involved some of his muso's friends from City On A Hill, East. Again, Tim Grant did a great job as MC. In general, feedback with regard to the Convention was very positive.

We held a variety of electives some which were creative/responsive, including a session for taking time out to pray/receive prayer from the team, a write your own psalm elective, and a choir elective where women came together and learned a song which they presented in the final session.

Convention Lodge. We are hoping for attendance of 50. The dates for 2024 are 29 April to 3 May with the speaker being Daryl McKerlie leading studies from Colossians with the theme of "A life worth living".

Stephen Gaukrodger from the UK was our speaker and his visit was facilitated by him speaking at Mt Tamborine on the previous weekend. He addressed the theme "A letter to my younger self" from 2 Timothy.

Property Report

Staff and Volunteers

Devin Le Page continued in his role as a full time Property Manager, however he experienced deteriorating health which impacted on his ability to perform satisfactorily. He resigned from his position in July 2023. The position was advertised and Louwrens Theron expressed a desire to return as Property Manager. He was appointed to the role in September 2023 and has been performing well since then.

We have been blessed with a good number of regular volunteers attending the monthly working bee days with numbers up to 20 people, which has been an encouragement to us all. A number of other regular volunteers come each Thursday.

Phil Abbott, Roy Watson and Andrew Rhyder have been a great help to Tony Evans, our Project Manager, for the new accommodation/dining facility and have continued supporting the Property Manager with a wide range of activities around the property. Rob Small continues to do much of our electrical work. Sharon Robertson has also been on site one day a week to oversee the extensive planting works the have been done on the property.

2023 Projects

Creek Work - In 2023 we received another small grant from the Melbourne Water Stream frontage program to do clean-up work on German Creek, which was to engage a contractor to supplement the work already done by BHC. This program has been going for several years with good results. This exercise has significantly improved our relationships with neighbours with whom we now have regular meetings. We have also applied for another grant for 2024.

Planting The Shire of Yarra Ranges has a project called "Ribbons of Green" which involved providing 1500 plants to be planted around the property in 2023. This was supervised by Sharon who was through Tim Norton able to secure the services of a local scouts group to help with the planting. Sharon has also been involved in general landscaping around the property.

Major Development Project – Hope Centre

An important and main activity of the Property Committee has been to provide support and guidance to our Project Manager, Tony Evans, who attends the fortnightly meetings.

Significant progress has been made on the construction of both the accommodation and dining facility with construction finance being available through Baptist Financial Services. Tony has managed all the onsite contractors effectively with construction completion achieved in December 2023.

Jim Finger is arranging further supply of furniture and other items from China, with another shipment planned for 2024.

It was planned to obtain a certificate of occupancy to enable the building to be operational for the summer convention and this was achieved on 22 December.

We continue to thank and praise God for His guidance throughout the year and look forward to new opportunities in 2024.
